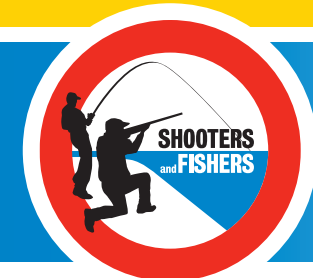

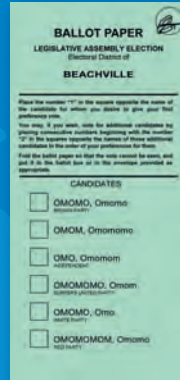

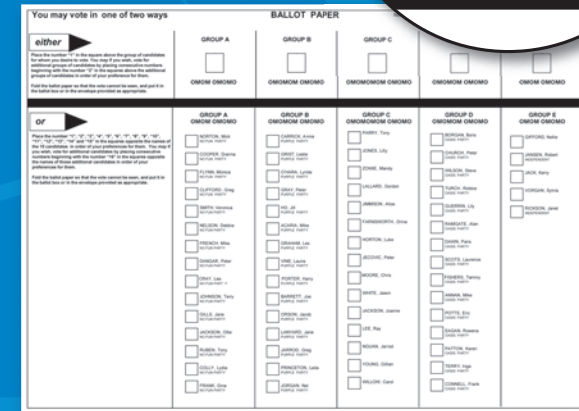
The small ballot paper

YEAR	TITLE OF BILL	OUTCOME OF VOTE
1996	Victims Rights Bill and Victims Compensation Bill	Bill passed both Houses of Parliament Note This was a Government Bill greatly influenced by John Tingle with the Government, Opposition and all other Parties and Independents agreeing to all The Shooters Party amendments, which were considered to be excellent by all, and the Bill itself, is considered one of the most important pieces of legislation to have been passed in the NSW Parliament
1998	Home Invasion (Occupants Protection) Bill	Bill passed both Houses of Parliament Supported by Labor, Liberal/Nationals and Christian Democratic Party Opposed by Greens and Australian Democrats
1998	Crimes Amendment (Firearms and Other Offensive Weapons or Instruments) Bill	Defeated in Legislative Council Supported by Liberal/Nationals and Christian Democratic Party Opposed by Labor, Greens, Australian Democrats and other Independents
2001	Workplace (Occupants Protection) Bill	Bill passed both Houses of Parliament Supported by Labor, Liberal/Nationals, Christian Democratic Party and other Independents Opposed by Greens and Australian Democrats
2001	Crimes (Sentencing Procedure) Amendment (General Sentencing) Bill [formerly Crimes (Sentencing Procedure) Amendment (Assaults On Aged Persons) Bill]	Bill passed both Houses of Parliament Supported by Labor, Liberal/Nationals, Christian Democratic Party and other Independents Opposed by Greens and Australian Democrats
2002	Game and Feral Animal Control Bill	Bill passed both Houses of Parliament Note This was a Government Bill, which established a Statutory authority for the management and control of game and feral animals through the Game Council, and was greatly influenced by John Tingle with Government, Opposition and Christian Democrat support, but vigorously opposed by the Greens, Australian Democrats and other Independents

2005	Crimes and Firearms Legislation Amendment (Apprehended Violence Orders) Bill	Bill defeated in Legislative Council
2006	Firearms Amendment (Good Behaviour Bonds) Bill	Bill passed both Houses of Parliament Supported by Labor, Liberal/Nationals and Christian Democratic Party Opposed by Greens, Australian Democrats and other Independents
2008	Administrative Decisions Tribunal Amendment (Confidential Documents) Bill	Defeated in Legislative Council on Third Read Supported by Liberal/Nationals and Christian Democratic Party Opposed by Labor and Greens
2008	Port Macquarie-Hastings Council Election Bill	Bill passed by Legislative Council and held up by Labor in Legislative Assembly Supported by Liberal/Nationals, Christian Democratic Party and Greens Opposed by Labor
2008	Firearms Amendment Bill	Bill passed both Houses of Parliament Supported by Labor, Liberal/Nationals and Christian Democratic Party Opposed by Greens and Gordon Moyes in the Legislative Council and by Independents Rob Oakeshott, Clover Moore and Greg Piper in Legislative Assembly
2009	Game and Animal Control Amendment Bill	Bill held up in Legislative Council because of opposition from Labor and the Greens, with the National having circulated a significant number of amendments to the Bill as well
2010	Firearms Legislation Amendment Bill	Bill passed both Houses of Parliament Supported by Labor, Liberal/Nationals and Christian Democratic Party Opposed by Greens and Gordon Moyes
2010	Marine Parks Amendment (Moratorium) Bill	Bill held up in Legislative Council because of opposition from Labor and the Greens
2010	Water (Commonwealth Powers) Amendment Bill	Notice of Motion to introduce a Bill currently before the House Note This is a Bill for an Act to amend the Water (Commonwealth Powers) Act 2008 and certain other Acts to provide greater certainty to the farmers of this State, and have the NSW Government withdraw from the Agreement on Murray-Darling Basin Reform, which refers the management of water to the Commonwealth
